ABOUT US

The Mentally Healthy Schools Program aims to embed the Act Belong Commit™ principles in schools to boost the mental health and wellbeing of students, staff and parents.

Taking a whole-of-school approach, Mentally Healthy Schools (MHS) focus on the classroom, school environment and broader school community. Importantly, MHS encourage students to adopt mentally healthy behaviours early in life to help build resilience and reduce the stigma around mental illness.



WHAT WE ACHIEVED

Over the past year, the Stan Perron Charitable Foundation funding has enabled us to:

- Reach over 90,000 students
- Support schools to deliver over 700 Act Belong Commit™ events and activities
- Increase partner schools by 10%
- Develop 23 new school Act Belong Commit™ resources
- Co-deliver a Mentally Healthy Schools Professional
 Development Day to teachers and staff from schools across five regional areas of Western Australia
- Deliver bespoke webinars for school communities
- Bring cutting edge researchers to WA schools

IMPACT

Partner schools implement the program in their own way, so the types of activities and the way they promote mental wellbeing is tailored to their school communities. Teachers from schools across WA attended a dedicated professional development day in 2022 to develop skills and knowledge required to deliver the activities. This work is continually reviewed to ensure relevance and reach.

In 2023, a paper entitled the "Impact on Students of the Act Belong Commit Mentally Healthy Schools Framework" found the program had "clear implications not only for prevention of mental disorders, but for academic achievement, employment, and overall contribution to society." 
MATERIALS FOR THE CLASSROOM

In 2023 we focused on supporting schools to integrate the Act Belong Commit culture across the whole school community. This involved exploring and reviewing evidence of effective mental health promotion strategies in schools.

Findings highlighted the need for age-appropriate activities and messaging to engage more teachers and therefore reach more students. Consequently, we developed more evidencebased factsheets alongside classroom resources.

33 new resources were developed, including:

- Initiative resources
- Factsheets
- Classroom activities (such as worksheets, puzzles, breathing exercises and collaborative colouring)
- School holiday resources
- · Social media assets

CREATING HEALTHY ENVIRONMENTS

In 2022, the Ursula Frayne Catholic College Student Team organised the *Dressdown to Stressdown Day*, allowing students to try a range of activities in a supportive environment to promote mental wellbeing, reduce stress and try something new. The event won Catholic Education Western Australia's QCE Aware for Best Secondary Student Led Initiative.

Our team met with the Ursula Frayne's Student Team to provide additional information on promoting the Act Belong Commit message and to clarify their role in mental health; that it isn't to provide mental illness information or advocacy, but rather provide opportunities to promote the message of doing things for your own mental, physical, emotional and spiritual health.

ACTIVE AUGUST 2022

Active August aims to highlight various ways staff, students and the wider school community can act to improve their mental wellbeing. The idea is to engage the whole school community to initiate mentally healthy activities during August with the intention of encouraging ongoing participation.

Digital resources were created for schools to adapt to their local context including a social media kit with promotional tiles, a calendar with 31 days of ideas about ways children and families can be active, and a downloadable Active August poster.

REEARNA MORGAN

Mentally Healthy Schools Program Coordinator

Reearna Morgan is the new Program Coordinator for the Mentally Healthy Schools Program. Reearna has extensive experience in delivering health promotion programs within school settings. She led and implemented Foodbank WA's highly successful Food Sensations for Schools and School Breakfast programs. Reearna joined the Act Belong Commit team after working as a Program Officer at Healthway, the Western Australian Health Promotion Foundation. There she focussed on arts and community events and worked with community organisations to promote relevant health messages to their target audience. She worked on school-based programs including WA Opera, WA Music, Downsyde, WA Ballet and Barking Gecko Theatre Company to develop and implement strategies promoting the Act Belong Commit message within the community and school setting.

Reearna holds a Bachelor of Health Science Majoring in Nutrition and Minoring in Health promotion and is currently studying a Master of Teaching (Primary) at Edith Cowan University and is also a Committee member on the WA Health Promoting Schools Association.





HANNAH SAMSA

Act Belong Commit Campaign Manager

Hannah Samsa is the new Campaign Manager for the Mentally Healthy WA Act Belong Commit Program. Hannah specialises in developing, implementing, and evaluating comprehensive state-wide behaviour change programs in the fields of mental health, alcohol, and illicit drugs. In Western Australia she was the strategic public education lead for State Government led programs aiming to reduce alcohol and drug related harm. Campaigns developed by Hannah have contributed to more parents choosing not to provide alcohol to their teenager, more women choosing not to drink alcohol while pregnant or planning a pregnancy, less adults drinking alcohol at harmful levels and generating increased community support for policy and legislation changes that contribute to reduced rates of harmful alcohol consumption. Hannah will provide strategic support to the Mentally Healthy Schools Program.

Hannah holds a Bachelor of Communications (Advertising, Marketing), and Graduate Diplomas in Health Promotion and Psychology. She is currently studying a Graduate Diploma (Advanced) in Psychology at the University of Adelaide.





SHARYN BURNS

Mentally Healthy WA Co-Director

Professor Sharyn has recently joined the Mentally Healthy WA Team as Co-Director, alongside Associate Professor Christina Pollard.

Sharyn is Professor of Health Promotion in the Collaboration for Evidence, Research and Impact in the School of Public Health at Curtin University, Western Australia. She is Chair, Curtin University Human Research Ethics Committee. Sharyn is a health promotion practitioner and researcher with a specific interest in translational intervention-based research. Her research includes a specific focus on children, adolescents, young adults and parents and has been conducted in a range of settings with key focuses on sexual health, mental health, alcohol and other drugs and obesity prevention. Professor Burns has a strong background in school-based health promotion research and has expertise in conducting evaluations, in mixed methods research and in implementing innovative health promotion interventions.

She is the Principal Investigator on the Relationships and Sexuality Education Project that has been running since 2014. Sharyn also leads a range of other sexual and mental health-related research projects.
