NAIDOC Week is held every year in July, to recognise and celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

In the most recent Act Belong Commit Partner webinar, the Cultural Immersion Coordinator at Curtin University, Jayde Conway, shared with Partners best practice when engaging with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, as well as the importance of connection to Country.

Jayde also highlighted the differences between a Welcome to Country and Acknowledgement of Country, including who can do them, and how to create one that is more meaningful.

Act Belong Commit Campaign Manager, Rodney Glossop, also emphasised the importance of social and emotional wellbeing for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, and its connection to the Act Belong Commit principles.
